









'Deadly Dinosaur' Topic Home Learning

Write a list of questions that you would ask them about their job.</p> 
Verbal learning	<p>Use the internet to find out about dinosaurs; fiction or non-fiction.</p> 	<p>Write a book review about a dinosaur story that you have read. Remember to include the author, illustrator, main characters, setting, plot and why you liked the book. Give your book a rating out of 5.</p> 	<p>Create a circle map for all the things that you already know or things you have learnt about dinosaurs.</p>
