We would also like your child to be able to practise their phonic sounds and tricky words each day. Try out these sites...



Playdough Recipe

3 cups plain flour

6 teaspoons cream of tartar

3 tablespoons baby oil/vegetable oil

1 and half cups salt

3 cups water

(food colouring- optional)

Place all ingredients into a big saucepan and stir until firm and it doesn't stick to your fingers when touched.

Store in an airtight box.


