









'Misty Mountain Sierra' Topic Home Learning

Creative learning	<p>You made a volcano in the first week of term and used washing up liquid, vinegar, bicarbonate of soda and red food dye to make it erupt. Repeat the experiment at home and write instructions for someone else.</p> <p>Ask an adult to help you.</p> 	<p>Try and read some Beatrix Potter stories at home. Which is your favourite? Write a brief book review telling us why you enjoyed it.</p> 	<p>What would it be like to live in a mountainous region? Find out about daily life. How is it the same and different from yours?</p> 
Verbal learning	<p>Research mountain sports such as skiing, snow boarding, mountain biking and rock climbing. Make a scrap book page in your book. Include pictures and captions.</p> 	<p>There are many famous mythical creatures, for example, the Yeti. These often appear in stories. Make a wanted poster for a mythical creature of your choice.</p> 	<p>Create a fact file about a famous mountaineer such as George Mallory, Sir Edmund Hillary or Reinhold Messner.</p> 
Finding out	<p>Find out how different mountains are formed. Present the information in your book. Remember to include labelled diagrams.</p> 	<p>Find out about animals that inhabit a mountainous area in the world. How do they adapt and survive? Are any of them endangered? Why?</p> 	<p>Choose one of the world's highest mountains and create a Power-Point presentation all about it. Remember to include lots of images and information.</p>
