We enjoyed a short week in school this week, after a lovely half term holiday and, with it being Bonfire Night this weekend, our classroom learning has included the story of Guy Fawkes. We have...

- Learned the story behind Guy Fawkes and why we 'Remember, remember the 5th of November' every year. We enjoyed dressing up as King James I, Guy Fawkes, Robert Catesby and the King's soldiers as we re-enacted the story. We know that Guy Fawkes lived a long, long time ago (over 400 years ago!) and discovered that at that time, people wore very different clothes to us today.
- Explored words to describe the colours, sounds and sights of fireworks, joined in with a firework poem and have created our own fabulous firework artworks by using a range of materials and techniques to represent the shapes and patterns observed at a firework display.
- Been busy in our maths learning- exploring how we can represent numbers in different ways, for example using the numicon pieces, 5 frames and counters, picture cards, magnetic numbers and dice all to match the number card we had chosen. We also had a go at writing our numerals by recording our scores when playing a target game with a friend.

Philosophy Bear




Would you rather be a Giant or a Wizard?
