





This week we have taken part in Remembrance Day activities and have begun our new theme of 'Light Fantastic'. We have..

- Thought about how important light is to us. Light helps us to see, helps plants to grow, can keep us warm and can be used to create electricity.
- Shared the story 'The very lonely firefly' by Eric Carle to help us identify different light sources.
- Explored different materials with the torches to see which one would be best to let the light shine through on our firefly makes.
- learned that 'sight' is one of our 5 senses. Our senses help us to find out about the world around us. We explored how, even when we can't see, our other senses of smell, touch, taste and hearing can help us.
- Begun exploring our gymnastic skills in P.E. We used the equipment,
- pretending it was a pathway in the jungle, and moved like different jungle animals- jumping, leaping, slithering and prowling.
- Continued comparing numbers in our maths sessions through playing a 'pairs' game. We are using our subitising skills to help us say which of two cards show more/ fewer and can spot when the amounts are equal. We have also begun to explore the composition of numbers- seeing how 3 can be made from a 3+0 or 2+1 or 1+2 or 0+3.



For the home challenge this week we would like you to explore different light sources within your house. Be a light detective! How different are the light sources? Which give a bright light? Which give a dim light? Which lights are coloured? How small is the smallest light you can find?





Draw or take photos of some of the light sources you can see. Can you use your phonic sounds to label some of them? Listen carefully to the sounds you can hear and write them down (even if it is just the first sound you hear).
