This week we have completed our curriculum theme of 'Light Fantastic'. We have..

- Explored how lights are used in many different celebrations and festivals.
 We learned about Baptism as part of the Christian faith. A candle is given
 as part of the ceremony. We also learned how Diva lamps are lit as part
 of Diwali celebrations in the Hindu faith.
- Visited All Souls' church. We talked about the journey we needed to take
 to get from school to the church then looked for features of a Christian
 church when we got inside. We saw the lectern, altar, bell rope, organ,
 stained glass windows, pulpit and pews.
- Played lots of games in our maths sessions to help us with our understanding of '1 more' and '1 less' and how this links to us counting forwards and backwards.
- Continued to learn how to form our letter sounds- we have begun to look at how the tall letters: I, h and b are formed.
- Used rolling and pinching techniques to make our own Diva lamps out of clay, then used the different clay tools to add patterns to our creations.
- Begun to practise our Christmas songs and rhymes ready for our performance on the final week of term.
