Friday 9th January 2026

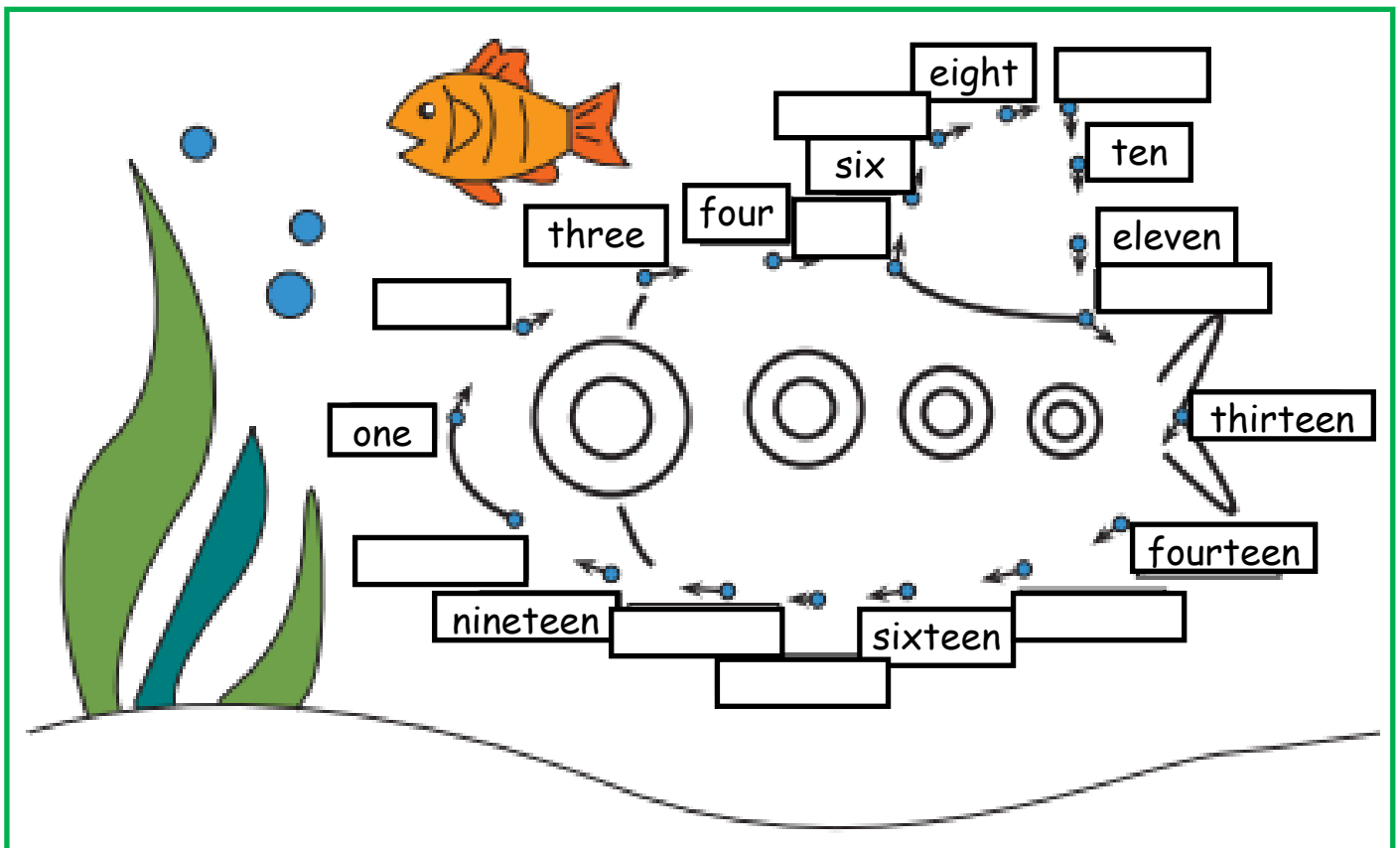
